



# CLIFF WALK

Newport, Rhode Island

**Chanler Inn:** The Chanler is a truly special part of the history of Newport and one of the most unique luxury hotels in the area.

**Cliffside Inn:** The former home of legendary artist Beatrice Turner, it has earned a worldwide reputation as one of New England's most distinguished Bed & Breakfast luxury Inns.

**The Breakers:** Is a National Historic Landmark, and is owned and operated by the Preservation Society of Newport County.

**Rosecliff:** Is one of the Gilded Age mansions of Newport, Rhode Island, now open to the public as a museum.

**Marble House:** Marble House is one of the Gilded Age mansions of Newport, Rhode Island, now open to the public as a museum.

**Belcourt Castle:** Its the former summer cottage of Oliver Hazard Perry Belmont, located on Bellevue Avenue in Newport, Rhode Island.

**Rough Point:** Rough Point is one of the fabled Gilded Age mansions of Newport, Rhode Island, now open to the public as a museum.

The Cliff Walk along the eastern shore of Newport, RI is world famous as a public access walk that combines the natural beauty of the Newport shoreline with the architectural history of Newport's gilded age. Wildflowers, birds, geology ... all add to this delightful walk.

In 1975 the walk was designated as a National Recreation Trail ... the 65th in the nation and first in New England. The walk runs 3.5 miles and about two-thirds of the walk is in easy walking condition. What makes Cliff Walk unique is that it is a National Recreation Trail in a National Historic District.
